

Case Study: Historic Buildings

- Client: Herstmonceux Castle
- Location: Near Herstmonceux, East Sussex

Summary:

Work has commenced at Herstmonceux Castle in East Sussex. The partial basement rooms, adjacent to the sunken garden of the West access to the castle, are being converted into offices. Stroma Building Control (formerly BBS Building Control) has been appointed the Building Control on the project and will be working closely with Stuart Page, the architect, and the building contractor, John Farrington & Co. Limited.

Herstmonceux Castle was originally a manor house, dating back to the 12th Century, but in the mid-15th Century the owner partitioned the crown for the right to fortify his manor and subsequently became a castle. Today the castle is home to the Bader International Study Centre providing education for students from around the world. The castle hosts many conferences throughout the year and also provides B&B accommodation within the estate.
